He currently serves as Commissioner in the Human Rights Commission of Sierra Leone and the legal and Human Rights Advisor for both Prison Watch Sierra Leone and Every Child Matters-(SL).Rashid holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree and Bachelor of Laws Honours Degree from Fourah Bay College University of Sierra Leone as well as an LLM Degree in International Human Rights Law from the Centre for Human Rights, University of Pretoria, South Africa and an LLM Degree in Petroleum Law and Policy from the University of Dundee, Scotland, United Kingdom. He has also been recently certified as Fellow by the Dean of Law, Kabarak University School of Law, Republic of Kenya.
